



ACL Blind Draw League Rules

Dates

- The ACL blind draw league will be held one Friday a month for 5 months starting in January 2016
- The 5th month will be the ACL playoffs (May 2016)
- There is NO commitment. Players may just come and play one tournament if they wish. However, players who want to be eligible for playoffs must play in at least 4 tournaments of the first 8. All players earn ACL League Points (no membership required)

Money Shot

- Will be held twice per night for the first 4 months (before each tournament)
- See money shot rules on the next page

Blind Draws

- Each month we will hold a doubleheader blind draw. That is, we will hold two tournaments each month, back to back, each being a blind draw where you are assigned a random partner.
- \$10/player per tournament to enter and a one-time \$5 ACL entry fee. 100% of the \$5 goes into the playoff prize purse.
- 70% payout for each tournament, 10% goes into the ACL Playoffs prize purse
 - o Prizes are paid out based on the following chart (see link)

- Players earn ACL league points for every league tournament that they enter. ACL points are used for the ACL State Championship tournament and the \$50,000 ACL Championships of Bags Event. The 5th week is the playoffs, tournaments that evening will be worth ACL Tournament points.

Playoffs

- Anyone who enters at least 4 of the 8 tournaments is eligible for the playoffs
- Playoff event is a blind draw, \$40/player to enter with each player getting **\$4 off** of this entry for every qualifier they enter. **ACL members also get \$10 off this entry fee.**
*For instance if a player enters all 8 tournaments and they are an ACL member then they would get to enter the playoffs for **free**. If they were not an ACL member they would play for \$40-(8*\$4) or \$8.

ACL Points

- ACL league points are earned for every tournament you enter for the first four months. ACL Tournament points will be earned during month #5 (Playoffs).

Money Shot Rules

The money shot will be held before each tournament throughout the league.

Just before a tournament begins each player will have the option to buy into the Money Shot for \$5/player. With your \$5 entry you have two chances to win.

1 – One lucky player will be chosen at random and will step up to a board with 4 bags in hand (and no additional warm-ups). They will toss all 4 bags to see how much of the Money Shot Prize Pot they will win. All bags remain on the board, so if you come up short on a bag or two you can still push them in with the remaining bags.

2 – EVERY player entered into the Money Shot will then pitch 4 bags. The player that scores the most points (bag in the hole is worth 3 points, bag on the board is worth 1 point) will win 1/2 of the money taken in for the Money Shot at that event. Ties are settled by having all players tied for the most points throw four bags again to see who wins.

* Please note that you MUST be entered into the tournament hosting the money shot in order to buy-in to the money shot.

Here is a breakdown of what the money shot player wins based on how many bags they make in part #1.

Money Shot Prize Breakdown	
4 in the hole	100%
3 in the hole	20%
2 in the hole	\$10
1 in the hole	\$5
0 in the hole	\$0

Points matter!

If after the last qualifying event of the year we still have money in the money shot prize pot, then we will run the money shot on playoff night. We will have player by player step up to see if they can make all 4 bags. The order of the players will be based on Total League Points earned throughout the year. The player attending the event with the most points will try first. If they fail to make all 4 bags, then the player with the second most points will try. We will go in order until somebody makes all 4 bags.

If two players are tied in points, then the first tiebreaker is total qualifying events entered. The player that has played in more events will get to try first. If the players have played the same number of events, then a coin toss will decide who goes first.
